
Dexter Promotion Group of Tasmania

A.I. Can

It was decided at the general meeting after the A.G.M. that the group would purchase an A.I. can which would be stored at the Rawlings Dexter Stud as they have a can of their own and it is logical and more cost effective to have the two cans topped up at the same time. This can will be available for use by any current financial

member with the cost of the top ups being shared by whoever has semen/embryos stored in the Group can. Marg will keep a record of anything stored in the can. There are 6 pots in the can so a rough cost will be about \$10 per pot every 2 months. So if 2 people are using 1 pot then the cost will be approximately \$5 each. What a great service this is going to be for our members.

Dexter tours in S.A. and W.A.

NLIS Tags & PIC's

I have left this in from the last newsletter due to the fact that when we received our PIC in 2007 we were never told that we had to do this, so I now have 5 years of transfers to catch up on. So don't delay, follow up and keep your information up to date on the database.

A PIC (Property Identification Code) is required by all owners of livestock to enable them to purchase and sell animals. This also forms the the NLIS (National Livestock basis for Identification System) and serves as a means of giving lifetime traceability to animals. An electronic tag needs to be applied to all animals prior to them leaving their property of birth. It is then the responsibility of the new owner to transfer the animal to their own PIC.
